### Salvation Army

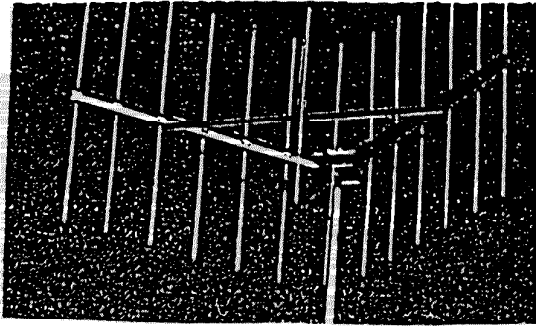

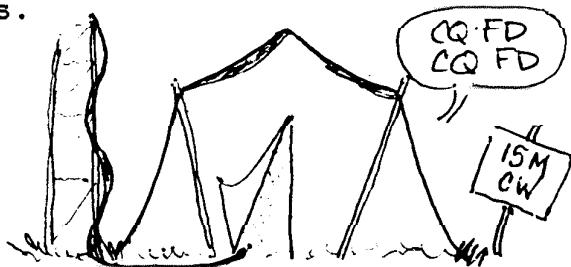
NET POINT NOTES

As usual, I'd like to thank all those NCO's who waste no time getting their check-in sheets to me. Their efforts are what make the net point tally meaningful. Hats off to Harry (W8VRW), Joe (K8OEF), Manny (KB8RBV), Floyd (KF8AT), Kevin (N8QVX), Linda (N8VVH), Velma (N8YVC), Eric (AA8MD), Jeff (N8XRB), Arpad (WY8M), Scott (KG8IE), Randy (KB8QXD), and Marion (N8MOJ).

As you can see, the "Top Twenty" is quite volatile this year. Our old system of tracking net points gave an advantage to less recent hams simply because the database went back 3 years. A new ham had little chance of ever making the top twenty as he/she had no way of making up for the years past. I'm glad to report that the changes made in the net point tracking system seem to have affected our nets favorably! Net check-ins have become more numerous and more regular (although, I do remember a few astounding nets in years past that had over 100 check-ins). It's also good to see that many of our "older" hams are still in the "Top Twenty" list, showing that their enthusiasm for Amateur Radio still thrives.

I do know this... as a club we are doing something right.
