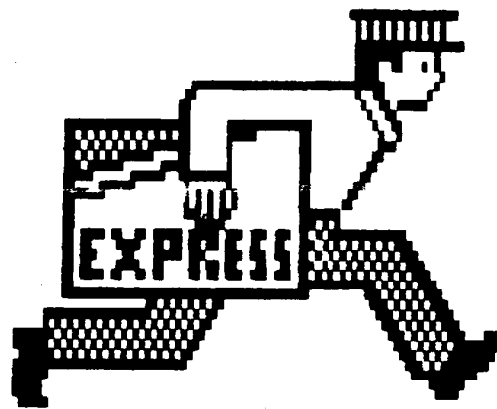

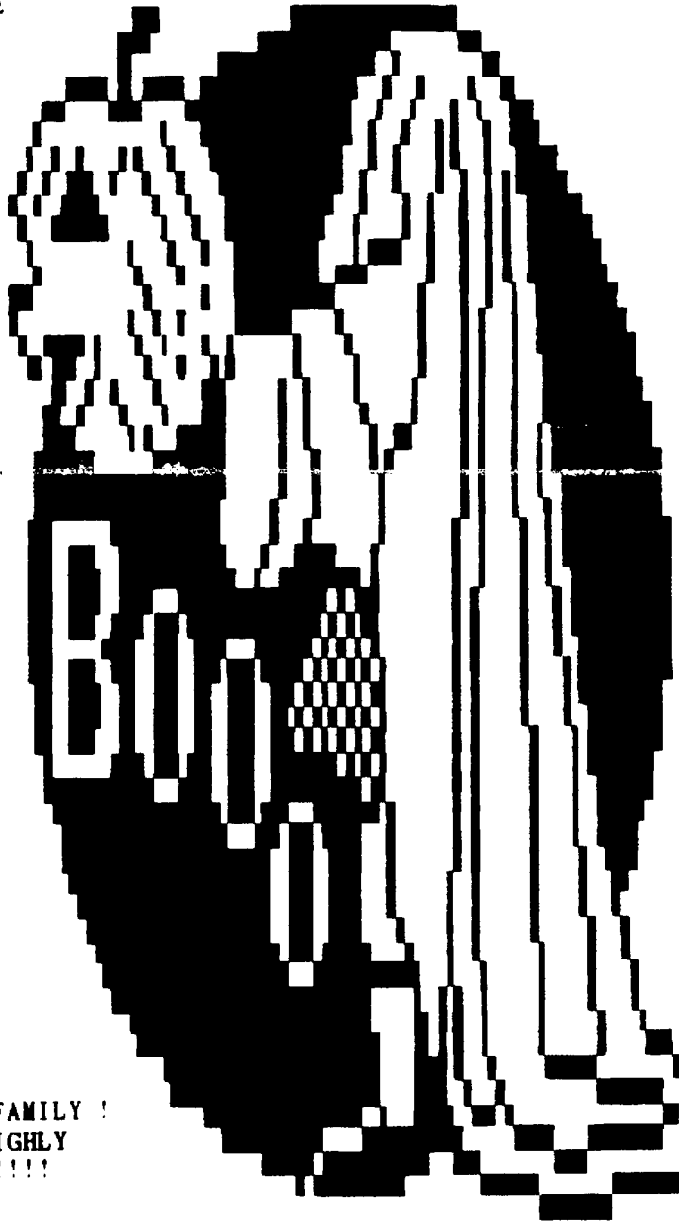

FIELD DAY 1992



Field Days' come and go but as with any event that is held on an annual basis; each year brings with it an unique set of experiences. It is these experiences that enable us to distinguish one annual event from the next, 1992 is not exception.

USECA runs a big show, so to speak. In fact our Club considers Field Day it's biggest event of the year (except Swap, of course). 1992 proved once again to be the big event. Attendance reached an all time high for the Club, 351, thanks to the diligent efforts of many members and public advertising on our local cable station.

Our kitchen crew, headed by MARK/KB8SW, kept hunger and sleepiness at bay. Such scrumptious meals as chili dogs and hamburgers; roast beef, potatoes and fresh corn on the cob; breakfasts of eggs, sausage and pancakes and of course our now locally famous PIG ROAST, including polish and beef sausage with an abundance of tantalizing side dishes provided by many club and non-club participants.

Of course Field Day is more than just food. The excitement of assembling and bringing to life a station under simulated emergency conditions provides challenge and fun. The unexpected is always expected, this year it visited often.

Our satellite station, headed by RON/N8FOW, almost wasn't when the amplifier was fried, but an alternate source for adequate watts was secured. Our 160 station had by far the tallest tower around and ole Glory waved her bright stars and stripes. However, a faulty antenna switch eluded our station chair until almost too late. How

frustrating to hear your fellow hams on the band and not be able to transmit an audible signal in return, just ask Jerry/K8CFY.

15CW proved a struggle throughout the contest period. Each of it's 90 contacts were well earned by those participating along with station chair, Brian/A8SCY. All ear strained to pick out the signals heard and patience reigned in the laborious exchange.

Over at 20CW all seemed well at the outset, however, it was quickly determined that the hope for magmount wasn't working out, (I have such sympathy for Walt/WB8E), and up went the dipole. Then as the contact were beginning to roll; down goes the computer! This proved to be nothing more than a loose connection and nothing was lost (thank goodness). Connection was re-established with ardent warning to all who entered to stay clear of the wires and onward they went.

A young crew handled 15SSB receiving encouragement from various seasoned operators as they called cq, cq and hunted for the contact. This under 20 crew, chaired by Greg/KB8LTF turned in a nice showing of 160 contacts.

Novice/Tech surpassed last years' results which had been an all time high for the Club. This years contacts totaled 168, all in CW. Not too shabby for 5 words per minute. Of course their superb performance while well earned by Nathan/N8MBK would not have been realized without the patient dedication given by John/W18L and John/K8DHA.

According to a station heard on the airwaves over at 20SSB, a "broad" was trying to transmit on the frequency, however, this was one YL not intimidated by the usage of "broad" and Trish/KB8IKZ, (advanced ticket holder), maintained the frequency and secured the contacts.

After a dismal 1991, 40CW, with Gordie/WBSH at the helm was back in the saddle again. The likes of Mike/WX3L; Don/WX3M, and Bill/KASCBZ kept the key hot and the contacts rolling!

We had a slight mix-up at 80CW, miss-communication if you will. Somehow Arpad/WYSM never quite made it clear to Fred/WBSITB, that Fred was to supply the entire station plus operate. Not to worry, Fred, never the chump was a champ and came through with the necessary equipment and stayed up all night securing contacts.

40SSB, while working the contacts acted as the meeting place for GMARC members headed by Joe/WQ4I and Ann/KB4FXV. Glad we were able to help out a new Club.

The most creative sign around was hanging over at 17SSB/CW. Between Marion/NSMOJ; Gaylen/WD8PIQ; and Dave, KF8CT, (Dave originally started out with the intent of working 12 meters but the computer sorta wiped his station right out), I think 17 meters pulled in all that could be feasibly expected and then some. Also, Gaylen proved to be of invaluable assistance on a number of occasions with his technical expertise. We plan on seeing more of this next year!

Propagation, as you might know, hasn't been all that great as of late, no where was this more noticeable than 10SSB. Norm/K8KSE, try as he might, couldn't change static into voices. Contacts were few and far between but hopefully Norm & company had a fun weekend. You never know, maybe next year, 10meters will be gangbusters!

Last but by no means least, 75SSB, or 11 meters so said their sign, went to town! If it was out there, they were determined to get it, didn't matter what it took, even promises of some kinda

calendar...the contacts were gonna be theirs! When all was said and done an impressive 807 contacts were made, rather befitting considering the crew. Thanks to Jeff/N8LYW, Sean/WX8L and various other riff ra....er...I mean operators, we had an impressive turn out on 75 SSB.

Yes, Field Day 1992 does hold it's own unique memories. Remember the hail? I think there was at least 2 inches of it on the ground Friday night. We also had dinner with music thanks to the many, many, many trips that Gordie/WBSH and Pat/N8LOG made between their home and the Field Day site. Lending a musical hand to Gordie's lead and Pat's singing were Cole/N8OWI; Jim/N8PNQ; Pat/N8OEQ; Bill/KF8FK and some rather unique keyboard playing by Bill/N8NMX. Providing lead vocals for our evening's pleasure was Jeff/N8LYW.

Of course for some of us the weekend didn't exactly provide a thrill a minute...ask Walt/WBSE. Poor man, had to suffer through a 24 ounce flu. Yes that little bug was quite flighty, it managed to move Walt's car to the middle of the field and make things a bit messy in the tent...guess Walt wanted to stay put but the little bug had other ideas. 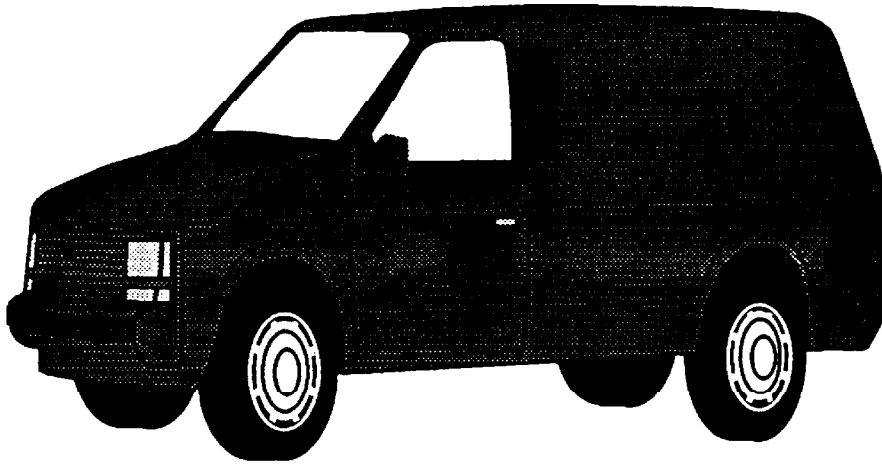

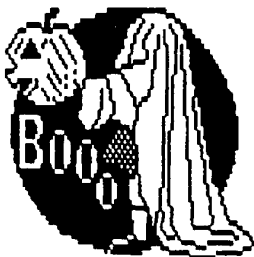
